


# **START HERE!**




### 1. INTAKE

Water for Prince William County Service Authority customers comes from three sources: the Potomac River, the Occoquan Reservoir, and Lake Manassas. The average person uses about 100 gallons of water each day. That's 3,650 gallons a year! Follow the maze to discover the journey of drinking water from the source to your home.



# 2. COAGULATION

Alum is added to help the gunk in the water stick together.




## 3. SEDIMENTATION

Once the dirty pieces are stuck together, they get heavy, sink to the bottom and are cleared.



#### 4. OZONATION

A special kind of air called ozone is added to the water to help clean out germs.



## **5. FILTRATION**

Water passes through charcoal filters to remove any small pieces of dirt left in the water.



#### 6. CHLORINATION

Chlorine is added to the water to make sure it stays clean and fresh.



### 7. DISTRIBUTION

Clean water arrives at your home and school.
